HUMMINGBIRD

Raleigh, North Carolina

This new cocktail spot celebrates small plates and floral, fruit-forward drinks in a bright, convivial atmosphere. The cafe serves hip breakfasts—ricotta fritters and boozy coffee or avocado toast with a bloody mary—and late-night indulgences like the Soyer au Champagne, a coupe filled with ice cream, bubbly, Luxardo, and brandy.

BINDAAS FOGGY BOTTOM

Washington, DC

The Capitol City's Foggy Bottom neighborhood has a new spot for street food. Bindaas lives up to its Hindi name—meaning independent, cool, and carefree—with an open kitchen and decorative murals fueling the food market vibe. The menu, translated from the restaurant's original Cleveland Park location, includes traditional curries and a chicken burger with beet and tomato chutney.

WOOLWORTH ON 5TH

Nashville, Tennessee

Site of the civil rights movement's famous lunch counter sit-ins, Woolworth on 5th honors its history with a new restaurant and menu that explores the roots of Southern foodways. The newly restored Woolworth department store building includes original details, like the terrazzo floors that still bear marks from the pre-1960s segregated lunch counter.

MAE'S FOOD HALL

Cullman, Alabama

Inspired by spunky Southern grandma Linnie "Mae" Quick, Mae's Food Hall brings five new dining options together under one roof. Ruckus, an Art Deco bar, and Mexican ice cream shop Lichita's, are among the venues housed in the 6,500-square-foot space.
